LWSIT was registered formally as a National NGO in 2008 thus changing its identity from a country program of LWF/DWS, Geneva to a national organisation in India. LWSIT has inherited a rich legacy of experience by implementing various development projects both in rural and urban areas, humanitarian response and disaster risk reduction projects across India.

The organisation works on the thematic areas of Sustainable Livelihood, Environment Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction, Gender Justice and Peace Building, Education, Health and Organizational Development. The main purpose of LWSIT is to empower disadvantaged communities and it focuses mainly on Odisha, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Assam, while it responds to disaster management in Pan India.

On 5th June 2024 World Environment Day was celebrated throughout the LWSIT projects focussing on the theme of the year: Land restoration, desertification and drought resilience, as the year marks the 30th anniversary of the UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).

On 5th June, *World Environment*Day was celebrated in LWSIT

earth. The Day had rallies with
participants, holding saplings for
the plantation. Banners and
placards were highlighted with
slogans on the importance of
environmental care and that it is
the vital role of life.



The People's Representatives to the Self-Government also played an active role in these Programs and created great enthusiasm. The local Sarpanch, Ward Members, school teachers and students joined the rallies spontaneously. Both women and men joined the movement not only for the plantation but also took oaths to water these plants regularly



In the EHELL Project, Nabarangpur Unit - The operational communities of LWSIT have a meagre literacy rate and are unaware of dengue and malaria. The murals have been created in 25 different locations across 15 communities to depict the symptoms of these diseases & illustrate the preventive measures. By using clear, engaging visuals, these murals help people recognize the signs of these diseases early and take necessary actions to prevent them.



In the STEER Project, Bankura Unit - Support of books, notebooks and admission fees were provided to 16 poor Girl Students of Classes XI & XII, which helped them to continue their quality education and pursue higher studies



In the CCAM Project, Birbhum Unit - Campaigning & mass rally on climate resilience, disaster preparedness, environment protection, tree plantation, recycling, reuse and reduction was organised. This program highlighted the importance of natural resource management and emphasised the role of tribal communities towards the conservation of forest areas for future generations' benefit.



The Staff Retreat 2024 was organised by LWSIT from 6th June to 8th June at Ocean Vista Bay Hotel, Vishakhapatnam. Staff members from all projects, the National Office and the Board members attended the program. Three external consultants were invited to conduct sessions and give reflections on Gender Disparity, Climate Change Adaptation & Mitigation and FCRA rules and Regulations.



In the GEP, Bhubaneswar Unit - Asian Zone Emergency & Environment Cooperation Network (AZEECON) Exchange Exposure Training Visit (EETV) – 2024 program was hosted by LWSIT at Bhubaneswar, Odisha. A total of 10 representatives from India, Myanmar, Nepal & Cambodia participated in 3 days of Exchange, Exposure Training & Visit of the GEP BBSR Unit. The program was followed by a two-day in-house training program on Gender by resource person Dr. Urmimala Das, Retd. Professor of Berhampur University and one exposure visit to the urban communities.

In the CCAM Project, Assam Unit - An awareness program was organised focussing on the impact of human actions on climate change, including decreasing rainfall and risina temperatures. They also emphasized the importance of checking deforestation and planting more trees as a mitigation step to address climate change issues and a great challenge ahead to check and reverse damage caused by human actions to the general environment.



#### **Emergency Response & Relief Distribution**

In Manipur, LWSIT completed the relief distribution with support from CLWR. With available resources, additional Rice and Dal (pulses) were provided to 397 families considering their needs living in the relief camps. As drinking water scarcity was seen during the LWSIT also provided safe drinking water to the IDPs who are living In the relief camps. The WASH/Hygiene Kits



are particularly beneficial to women and adolescent girls to manage their menstrual hygienic practices.

#### **CSR Initiatives**

290 beneficiaries received free spectacles from the eye check-up camp held in collaboration with VRX Lab. Mahamaya Das, a 53-year-old disabled woman living in a Shelter for Urban Homeless run by LWSIT, has been struggling with eye problems. Her physical challenges made it difficult for her to get eye treatment. In March 2024, Mahamaya participated in the eye checkup camp and received free spectacles which greatly improved her vision.
